Doug Hausse 	<p><i>Species:</i> human being <i>Age:</i> early 40's <i>Occupation:</i> TV documentary maker</p> <p>Absolutely, the world – and beyond – is waiting for him to become the “<i>King of TV personalities,</i>” so far he <i>knows</i>.</p> <p>Although his work isn't really bad – it's rather pointless -, he can't fathom his own limitations.</p> <p>He dreams a lot, but his dreams are even worse than being awake. He gains some satisfaction by bullying his house mate <i>Linda</i>, but is actually no match for her in that pathetic game.</p>
Linda Faykes 	<p><i>Species:</i> human being <i>Age:</i> mid 30's <i>Occupation:</i> TV talk show babe, former flight attendant</p> <p>The words “success story” written all over her. She is the <i>real</i> celebrity of KRAP-TV and thus very popular among her fans.</p>
Joe Brixton 	<p><i>Species:</i> human being <i>Age:</i> late 60's <i>Occupation:</i> psychiatrist (who should never have been one)</p> <p>Lost soul, a “<i>will-never-ever-have-a-date</i>” type, who lives in his own world. He idolizes Freud as the master of psychiatry and as the painter of self-portraits.</p>

<p>Henry Hausse</p> 	<p><i>Species:</i> human being (Doug's father) <i>Age:</i> early 80's <i>Occupation:</i> owner KRAP-TV</p> <p>Prophesizes his son to be a celebrity and sports hero.</p>
<p>The Mole</p> 	<p><i>Species:</i> a mole, obviously <i>Age:</i> who cares how old she is <i>Occupation:</i> siestas and yelling "Pff. Who cares?"</p> <p>Shows up every now and then, but especially when you don't expect her. She is small, but very tough to deal with.</p>
<p>Jim</p> 	<p><i>Species:</i> human being <i>Age:</i> could be anything between 15 and 50 <i>Occupation:</i> Doug's camera man</p> <p>A man without any ambition whatsoever, easily overlooked.</p>
<p>Kate</p> 	<p><i>Species:</i> human being <i>Age:</i> early/mid 30's <i>Occupation:</i> light sleeper and Doug's dream</p> <p>We only know little about her. Maybe better to keep "as is."</p>
<p>J.L. Seagull</p> 	<p><i>Species:</i> seagull, former book and movie child star <i>Age:</i> unknown, he is still trying to grow up <i>Occupation:</i> finding the meaning of life</p> <p>Learns that outsmarting a low-on-the-food-chain fish doesn't do the trick. He realizes that he needs more lessons.</p>
<p>Teacher</p> 	<p><i>Species:</i> human being <i>Age:</i> could be anything between 75 and 135 <i>Occupation:</i> teaching us what we know better</p> <p>Annoying, always showing up when you don't need him.</p>
<p>Mr. Airmail</p> 	<p><i>Species:</i> human being, dressed as a giraffe <i>Age:</i> no idea how old he is. How can you tell? <i>Occupation:</i> trying to overcome difficulties in life (his wife)</p> <p>Low self-esteem, in spite of spreading the (false) news that he has a high position in a university's psychology department.</p>
<p>Mr. Smith</p> 	<p><i>Species:</i> human being, dressed as a dinosaur <i>Age:</i> pushing 70.000.001 <i>Occupation:</i> by all means trying desperately keeping the dinosaur "We rule the world" myth alive</p> <p>Arrogant, loses himself in his own (lack of) reasoning.</p>

<p>Mr. Johnson</p> 	<p><i>Species:</i> human being, dressed as a hippopotamus <i>Age:</i> nobody knows, even he doesn't <i>Occupation:</i> nobody knows, even he doesn't</p> <p>Lives in slow-motion and can't keep up with others.</p>
<p>Mr. John<u>ss</u>on</p> 	<p><i>Species:</i> human being <i>Age:</i> could be anything between 40 and 70 <i>Occupation:</i> studies elephants and their long/short term memory</p> <p>Has himself intimidating long-term memory capabilities, but totally lacks the short-term version.</p>
